

# Key issues of child rights highlighted during State-level conference at Yupia



YUPIA, Mar 12: A one-day State-Level Conference on key issues concerning child rights was organized by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights in collaboration with the Women and Child Development Department and the District Administration, Papum Pare, today at the ZPC Conference Hall, Yupia.

The conference featured an inaugural session followed by a technical session later in the afternoon, bringing together officials, stakeholders, and members of child protection institutions to deliberate on pressing issues related to the protection and welfare of children.

Speaking on the occasion, Anya Ratan, Chairperson of the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, emphasized the collective responsibility of all stakeholders in nurturing children and creating a safe environment for their development. She stressed that ignorance of the law cannot be an excuse and highlighted the importance of institutions such as the Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) and the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), which are mandated to safeguard children's rights.

She observed that although these bodies exist, lack of coordination and delayed responses often affect the effective implementation of child protection laws at the grassroots level.

Referring to a recent bul-

lying incident in a Sainik School that reportedly led to the death of a student, she informed that the SCPCR has initiated steps towards the enactment of anti-ragging legislation, which will soon be tabled. She also raised concerns over the misuse of social media among children and urged parents to monitor their children's internet usage and online interactions.

Speaking on the occasion, DC, Papum Pare, Vishakha Yadav stated that nearly one-third of the country's population consists of young people, making it essential to nurture and guide them properly. She highlighted growing concerns such as suicides among youngsters and cases registered under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO), and stressed the importance of awareness and community involvement in addressing these issues. She added that the conference aims to bridge the knowledge gap regarding laws and legal mechanisms that protect

children's rights.

She also referred to recent ragging incidents in some private schools and informed that the district administration is preparing a strict Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for residential schools, which will be enforced soon.

Superintendent of Police Taru Gusar also addressed the gathering, emphasizing the importance of responsible parenting and proper guidance. He highlighted practical issues prevalent in the state, including concerns related to underage domestic helpers and juvenile problems such as drug addiction and exploitation, and called for collective efforts from all stakeholders. Earlier, Miti Libang, Member SCPCR welcomed the participants and encouraged them to actively engage in the discussions and benefit from the conference.

In the afternoon, the conference continued with a technical session featuring expert presentations. Shivendu Bhushan, IPS, Superintendent of Police (Crime) and Head of the Special Investigation Team (SIT), conducted a session on bullying and cyberbullying in schools, focusing on their identification, prevention, and re-

sponse mechanisms.

Taba Zim, Chairperson of the Child Welfare Committee, Itanagar Capital Region, delivered a session on building a safe environment for children and emphasized the role of teachers, parents, and institutions in empowering and protecting children.

Lekha Asha Nyelam, Member of the Juvenile Justice Board, Itanagar Capital Region, conducted a session on issues related to child trafficking and mechanisms for prevention and intervention.

Bahi Koyu, CDPO-cum-State Nodal Officer of Mission Shakti, delivered a presentation on the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, highlighting provisions for prevention, prohibition, and redressal of sexual harassment at workplaces. The technical session concluded with an interactive open house discussion where participants raised queries and shared concerns, which were addressed by the resource persons.

HoDs, Teachers, CDPOs, Anganwadi workers, police officials, Gaon Buras and Gaon Buris attended the programme.

# Seva Aapke Dwar 2.0 brings govt services to doorsteps of Mengkeng Miri residents

# Sikabamin, Mangnang selected as Integrated Pest Management model villages

SIKABAMIN (East Siang), Mar 12: A state-level workshop on "Healthy Crops, Healthy Farmers: Promoting Integrated Pest Management (IPM) for Sustainable Agriculture-cum-Kisan Mela, was held at Sikabamin village on Wednesday with the objective of spreading awareness on sustainable farming practices and pest management among farmers.

The programme was organised by the College of Agriculture Pasighat under the Central Agricultural University Imphal in collaboration with the ICAR-National Research Institute for Integrated Pest Management, New Delhi, along with other agricultural research insti-

tutes.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr Shrawan Manbhar Haldhar, principal scientist of the ICAR-National Research Institute for Integrated Pest Management, shared his knowledge and expertise with farmers and emphasised the importance of maintaining healthy crops through scientific pest management practices. He informed that the research team has decided to develop IPM model villages so that successful practices adopted in selected villages can later be replicated in nearby areas.

Dr N Y Chanu, organising secretary and assistant professor of the College of Agriculture Pasighat, informed that Sikabamin village has been selected as a maize IPM

model village, while Mangnang village under East Siang will serve as a paddy and pulse IPM model village. She highlighted that farmers often either overuse chemical pesticides or avoid pest control measures altogether, both of which can negatively impact agricultural land and crop productivity.

The workshop witnessed participation from several institutions and stakeholders, including CHF Stall, Krishi Vigyan Kendra Pasighat, East Siang Sericulture, MS Ariculture Consultancy, Directorate of Sericulture East Siang, MS Lego Cane and Bamboo, MS Siang Biotech Pasighat, Nandan Nursery Jonai, and farmers from Sikabamin and Mangnang villages.

# 50 NCC cadets undertaking 10-day white water rafting course at Bhalukpong

BHALUKPONG, Mar 12: 2 APBn NCC Tawang in coordination with NIMAS is conducting a White Water Rafting course from March 8 to 17 at the Kameng River near Tippi, Bhalukpong in Arunachal Pradesh.


