

Anil Agarwal applauds Andhra Pradesh's 28,000 crore incentives for AM/NS project

BHUBANESWAR (correspondent) Vedanta Chairman Anil Agarwal has lauded the Andhra Pradesh government's decision to extend incentives for industries and has added states like Rajasthan, Odisha, Jharkhand, and Chhattisgarh are also well-placed to implement similar measures and compete for investment. In a recent post on 'X', formerly twitter, Mr Agarwal wrote about the incentive extended worth up to ₹28,000 crore to AM/NS for their integrated steel plant coming up at Anakapalli. He also highlighted the bold and timely steps of the Chief Minister of Andhra

Pradesh to attract large-scale industrial investment by addressing key issues in the manufacturing sector, such as stamp duty on land, GST, and the cost of power and water. He noted that such large projects will create significant employment opportunities and boost economic activity in the region. Odisha Ramps Up Monsoon Disease Prevention with Robust Health Measures

BHUBANESWAR (correspondent): As the monsoon season sets in early across Odisha, bringing with it the threat of infectious diseases, the state government has taken proactive steps to safeguard public health. In a high-level review meeting held today, Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja emphasised the urgent need for robust preventive measures to control the spread of diseases like malaria, dengue, jaundice, and cholera, which often surge during the rainy season. The meeting, attended by Commissioner-cum-Secretary of the Health and Family Welfare Department, Smt.



Aswathy S, along with senior health officials, outlined a comprehensive strategy to mitigate health risks. With rainfall already underway, Odisha faces an increased risk of waterborne and vector-borne diseases. The Chief Secretary directed officials to

identify dengue-prone areas, particularly in urban centres and municipal corporations, and sustain mosquito control initiatives. Measures such as the use of insecticide-treated mosquito nets and residual insecticide sprays were mandated for malaria-prone districts to curb the

Ahuja, urging officials to intensify efforts at the grassroots level. A key focus of the meeting was public awareness. The Chief Secretary called for widespread campaigns, extending from rural villages to urban centres, to educate citizens on preventive measures. He advised the public to remain vigilant about monsoon-related ailments such as colds and coughs, with special attention to the elderly and those with weakened immunity due to pre-existing conditions. "Health awareness is our first line of defence. We must empower people with knowledge to stay safe," he added.

Woman Killed By Nephew

Jeyapore (correspondent): A 40-year-old woman was brutally murdered by her own nephew in Minaguda village under Borigumma police station. The incident has sent shockwaves in the area. According to reports, the deceased Rukmani Penthia's husband, Kishwar Penthia, is mentally unstable, and the accused nephew allegedly took advantage of this situation to drag her away with malicious intentions. When Rukmani resisted, accused Dambhu Penthia brutally killed her with a knife. Rukmani was admitted to Jaipur District Medical College and later shifted to Koraput Medical College, where she succumbed to her injuries.

Thunderstorm Alert Issued for Odisha: Gusty Winds and Scorching Heat to Persist

BHUBANESWAR (correspondent) The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued an alert for thunderstorms accompanied by gusty winds reaching speeds of 30-40 kmph in several districts across Odisha. Alongside this, scorching heat and high humidity levels are expected to persist for the next few days. According to IMD forecasts, the districts likely to witness thunderstorms include Jharsuguda,

Sundargarh, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Nuapada, Kalahandi, Koraput, Malkangiri, Rayagada, Nabarangpur, Kandhamal, Sambalpur, Nayagarh, and Khurda. Residents are advised to take precautions against strong winds and lightning strikes. The IMD also stated that there will be no significant change in maximum temperatures across the state for the next six to seven days. While thunderstorms

might bring momentary relief, the overall weather pattern will remain hot and humid, especially in districts like Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam, and Gajapati. Authorities urge citizens to remain vigilant and stay indoors during severe weather conditions. Meanwhile, Odisha awaits further updates from IMD as summer temperatures continue to pose challenges for residents.

Doctor Suspended Over Pregnant Woman's Death In Nayagarh

Bhubaneswar (correspondent): The State government has suspended a senior gynaecologist following the death of a pregnant woman at the Nayagarh District Headquarter Hospital two days ago. The suspension comes after a district-level committee's inquiry report found Dr. Rabin Nath Sahu negligent in his duty. According to reports, Manama Swain, a 26-year-old woman from Balugana, was admitted to the hospital's maternity ward on Saturday due to labour pains. Her husband, Sanjay Kumar Nayak, alleged that Dr. Sahu demanded a bribe for performing a caesarean section, which he refused to pay. Nayak claimed that despite repeated requests, Dr. Sahu did not attend to his wife and failed to provide necessary medical treatment or refer her to another hospital.

Wrong Injection Allegations Surface as 5 Patients Die in Koraput Hospital

BHUBANESWAR (correspondent) A shocking incident at Saheed Laxman Nayak Medical College and Hospital (SLNMC) in Koraput has sparked outrage after five patients died within a short span of time on Tuesday night. The sudden deaths have led to allegations of wrong injections, prompting the hospital authorities to order an internal investigation. Several critically ill patients from various regions, including

Koraput, Borigumma, Kalahandi, Smitiguda, and Machhara, were being treated in the ICU and surgery wards of a hospital. Suddenly, between 11 pm and half an hour later, three patients in the ICU—Shukra Majhi, Rukuni Pentia, and Phulamati Majhi—died. Shortly thereafter, two more patients, Bhagaban Parija and Bati Khara, who were in the general surgery ward, also passed away.
